

"Owing to the fact that" we are to love God with all of our heart, soul, and mind, we are compelled and commanded to love our neighbors as we love ourselves (Matthew 22:37-40).

"Seeing that" Jesus offered the Great Commission to the disciples at His Ascension, we are part of the ongoing line of workers in the field tasked with making disciples for Jesus (Matt. 28:18-20, John 4:35-38).

I hope you have seen the connection between asking, "Why?" and the resulting litany of "because' reasons. We are in a unique position to impact our world with Good News of Jesus and bring those outside the

family of God a little closer to joining in on the glorious riches of God's grace through Christ Jesus (Philippians 4:19)

Dear Fellow Disciples,

What was the last invitation you received? It's hard to get anyone to actually commit to an event. We live in an age when invitations demand much of our time. It makes it hard to know which invitations to accept.



Our time is divided and the same is true for our students. Ultimately, the invitations I accept are the ones coming from people that matter to me. It's less about the event and more about the relationship. A misconception is that youth ministry is about getting teenagers to show up to events so they can hear about God and have their lives changed. In this mindset, it's the job of the church (also parents and youth pastors) to provide an exciting place to be. Teenagers have plenty of events to choose from, what is missing from their lives is authentic relationships with adults who love Jesus.

A relationship is always more compelling than an event. The power of an event fades, but a relationship lasts through the ups and downs of life. As a church, our goal isn't to invite teens to show up to an event, service or trip; it's to invite them into a relationship with other teens, Christ-reflecting adults and ultimately Jesus Himself. We are passionate about seeing teens walk with Jesus for a lifetime, well beyond their time in student ministry.

John 10:26 gives us a picture of what the process of walking with Jesus looks like,

... "But you don't believe me because you are not my sheep. My sheep listen to my voice; I know them, and they follow me. I give them eternal life, and they will never perish.

In this passage Jesus says His sheep will believe Him (which is more like an active faith instead of intellectual acknowledgement). How does that active faith come about?

- 1 Listening to Jesus: We are inviting students to listen to the voice of God through prayer, scripture and looking for signs of His work.
- **2 Knowing Jesus**: After we learn to listen to Jesus. We can discern His voice from others. We move from knowing about Him to actually knowing Him.
- **3 Following Jesus**: As teens develops a habit of walking with Jesus, they will experience life and security.

If you have a teenager in your life and want them to hold firm to their faith, then here are a few thoughts:

- Don't be satisfied with church attendance. Look for deeper spiritual markers (like prayers, Bible study, the fruits of the Spirit) as markers that they are walking with Jesus.
- Model the kind of relationship with Jesus you want them to have. Show them what it looks like to have an intimate relationship with Jesus on a daily basis. They won't believe it unless they see it lived out.
- Initiate the conversation by asking them how they are seeing God at work in their everyday lives.

FUMC is not an exciting place to be because we put on great events, but because many people here have a living relationship with Jesus. Our student ministries are thriving because we're inviting teens into that relationship every single time we meet. Thank you for being part of what makes FUMC great!
