Lenten breakfasts and Lenten luncheons will begin soon. Later in the summer our Mifflin County Week of Caring will launch on July 30 through August 3.




There will be opportunities to:



#### **Making Disciples: Stay Focused**

I often wonder if others, like me, allow their minds to go in different directions during our Worship service. So much is going on in everyone's life that our focus is not where it should be. Of course, there are days that I am able to shut the world outside our church doors. On these days, I truly believe the Scriptures and Sermon speak to me and that allows me to realize that God loves me and His grace is all I need.

I often reflect back upon St. Paul. Romans chapter 8 is one of the foundations of my faith. If you have not read Romans 8, I would encourage you to do so. Paul ends chapter 8 with an important question for us to think about. Paul asks who shall separate us from the love of Christ. 

What a great gift from God - His grace and love is all that we need. This is what Paul was telling the Philippians when he said, Rejoice in the Lord always. If we learn to rejoice in what God has provided to us, the peace of God which transcends all understanding will guard our hearts and minds

in Christ Jesus. As we begin to bring people to Christ, and hopefully to First Church, know that God goes before us to help us make disciples for Christ. He will guide our words, thoughts, and deeds bringing the Good News, the Gospel, to everyone we meet. Will it be easy, not always!! Paul states in Romans 5, we should rejoice in our suffering or struggles because that builds perseverance, character, and hope. Let us begin today to tell someone about Jesus and what He means to us and what He has done for us.

Pastor Randy often states that we should have a huge smile on our faces - Jesus put it there!! Now go out and make disciples. Make sure people see the light of Christ burning within us. This may be a struggle for some, but the Trinity goes before us making the journey of faith easier. We can make disciples for Christ; our faith will smooth the road ahead of us. We need to make that first step, leave our comfort zone.

Are we ready to tell others about the Awesome God we love and serve? Take that first step and do not look back, follow God who is always ahead of us and beside us. 

#### **Being His Hands and Feet**

When he saw the crowds, he had compassion on them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. Then he

said to his disciples, "The harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field." (NIV) Matthew 9:36-38

I often remind our teens that we are to be the Hands, Feet, Mouths, Eyes, and ears of Jesus as we serve in the name of Jesus by the way we live our lives, by helping those in need, by being the shoulder for someone to cry on and the genuine listening ear as someone needs to talk. I frequently challenge the teens to be that kind voice and the bright smile to the kid being bullied or out casted. You are the hands and feet of Jesus when you support the youth ministry. You take part in our Youth Ministry Program when you give monetary support, cook a meal, spend time with our youth, help on Wednesday, pray for the work or just smile at a child or teen and attend Youth Sunday. You are serving Christ in the larger world as our program reaches out to non-churched kids. Together we offer hope and light to a dark world and forming relationships that will extend the love of God in Jesus Christ.

There is major ministry going on in our Youth Program.

 Sunday school and Wednesday evenings Youth and Children program - Bonnie has been graciously providing an



opportunity for children's ministry on Wednesday evenings because the need arose through parents contacting us about their children coming to church. This is a separate program from our Youth Program. If you feel led to volunteer with the children's ministry in any way, please see Bonnie.

- Individual meetings of leaders with youth for talk over ice cream, sporting events, etc.
- Helping families in difficult times through their children.

Lives are being changed as our teens come to know Jesus in a very real and personal way. We pray for one another, we read and discuss the Word of God, we have open discussions about the real struggles that they as individuals and as a group encounter daily.

#### We are in need of people:

 to cook and serve and clean up meals on Wednesday Evenings,

- a few more adults to help as Youth Leaders,
- people to provide transportation to Youth group and home from Youth Group for some of the kids
- drivers or people to ride along for two adult coverage.

**In the last year** through the generosity of the people of First, Grace, Lake Park, the Valley Parish churches and others there have been over 550 times families have been helped financially. I thank God for you and your gifts that made this help possible.

**Through these encounters** there were also opportunities to share in the important situations of the lives of our neighbors. In hard times many are open to sharing deeply of spiritual, emotional, physical, and financial concerns. Prayer has been offered often and invitations have been extended for growth in faith.

**There were many others** who called, I responded by leaving messages that were not returned. Other times messages contained insufficient information to return calls. **In all, over \$17,500 were dispersed** to meet needs for shelter, food, medicine, diapers and personal items, transportation for medical appointments and work, and a myriad of miscellaneous needs.
