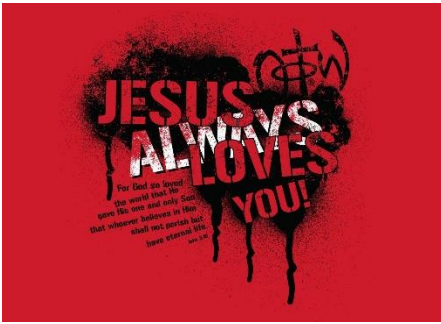

I want them to feel at home when they walk into the youth room. Participating in events allows them to gain a sense of belonging and to be known. The events are a time for teens to connect with one another and with leaders. When teens feel a sense of belonging in Christian community they are more likely to seek connection with Jesus. So please do everything you can to encourage your teen/s to come to events. We have financial assistance available so please never let money be a reason they cannot participate.

[How To Encourage Spiritual Habits in Kids](#)

Spiritual habits are such an important part of faith development. John Wesley called them “means of grace” because in these practices we place ourselves in the way of God’s grace and our lives become transformed. As parents and church leaders, we desire for ourselves and for our youth to develop and cultivate spiritual practices in our lives. One mom shares her story about the need for spiritual practices and the hopes of her kids growing into them. She offers three ways to encourage them in our children and youth: model it, teaching how to do them, and having spiritual conversations often.

Be a good role model

Have you ever seen the video with the [child trying to buckle herself](#) in the car seat? Rose is probably somewhere between 2 and 3 years old and she’s trying to buckle her car seat despite her heavy winter jacket being in the way. Her dad asks to help and she says no thank you. Then he says, “What do you want me to do?” And she says, “You worry about yourself.” Every time I see it I can’t help but chuckle. It’s so adorably cute. But it also reminds me that we are VERY much busted when it comes to the things we say as parents. Little Rose was simply responding that day in a way that she had already heard her parents respond. (Ahem... how many times have we told a child to worry about themselves?) I’m glad kids are so cute and I really enjoy laughing when my kids mimic something I know they got from me. But it’s more than just something to make us smile. These fun times should remind us that our kids are literally watching every single move we make.

So, what about the big stuff? Are we modeling spiritual habits that will help our kids grow in faith? Or are they watching us check the watch during the sermon or make a grocery list in the bulletin? Do they see us pray, or listen to us run to a friend when we have a problem?



**CHRISTIANS
AIN'T PERFECT
BUT JESUS IS!**

Recently, Jesus taught me a new name of His. Baal Perazim means "The Master of the breakthrough" or "The God who bursts through!" How cool is that! It comes from 2 Samuel 5:17-20. When David is faced with the Philistine army, he seeks God and, in obedience, is led to go down to the stronghold. He was to face His enemy boldly in the name of his victorious God. An important point in this story is that Goliath was taunting the sovereign Lord of the universe. He was challenging God's people to stand up to him and demonstrate that their God was more powerful than he was. Until David came into the Israelite camp, there was no one who was willing to step out in faith and face the giant. However, David's faith was so strong that he was willing to believe that the Lord would go with him and enable him to defeat Goliath (1 Samuel 17:36-37). David's faith was born out of his experience of God's grace and mercy in his life up to that point. The Lord had delivered him out of dangerous situations in the past, proving His power and trustworthiness, and David relied on Him to deliver him from the Philistine.

From the story of David and Goliath, we can learn that the God we serve is capable of defeating any of the giants in our lives—fear, depression, financial issues, doubts of faith—if we know Him and His nature well enough to step out in faith. When we do not know what the future holds,

we have to trust Him. But we can't trust someone we don't know, so knowing God through His Word will build our faith in Him.

As Christians who have trusted Christ as the only way to heaven (John 14:6), our battle with the giants in our lives will result in victory if we cling by faith to God and His power. The illustration of David and Goliath is only one of many examples of the supernatural power of our Lord. He cares deeply for His children and wants only our best. Sometimes that involves trials and battles, but these are ultimately for our good and His glory. James tells us to consider it pure joy when we encounter trials because they test our faith and develop patience and perseverance (James 1:2-4). When we are tested by these trials, we can, in the power of the Lord, stand up against any giant, trusting our Savior to win the victory.

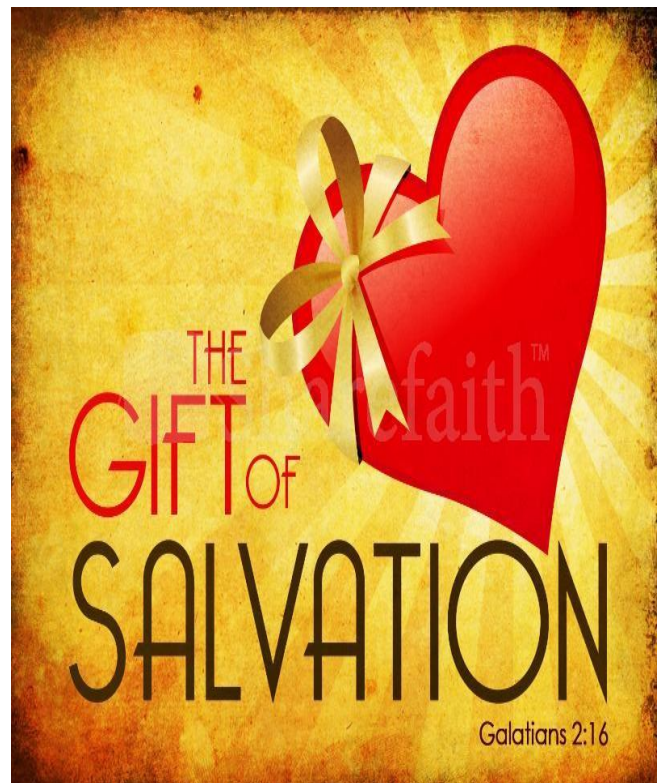

value) for the gift exchange game.

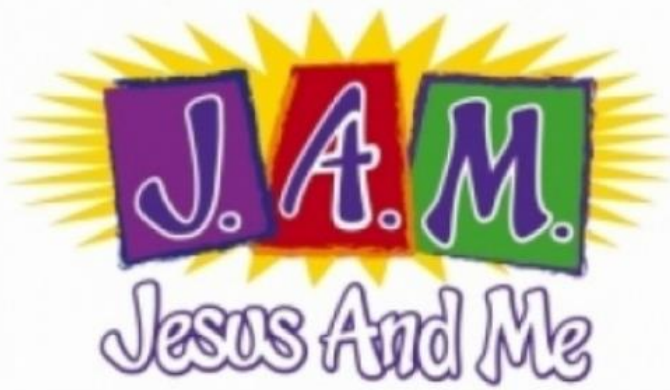
