Our Finance committee, headed by Laura Buffington, always seeks to fund important ministries while maintaining our buildings and grounds. The team has offered a modest budget to insure First Church has top notch staff and programs designed to make disciples for Jesus Christ and transform Lewistown.

The figure set forth for 2018 is \$386,259. Our Shares of Ministry to the Susquehanna Conference are set, and we expect to pay them in full once again.

Here are a few snapshots of just some of the 2017 ministry and mission that occurred because of your generosity. Thank you from the bottom of my heart as you continue to lead the way for faith development here in the Juniata Valley and Mifflin County.
