
If winter has had you on the run and you've been out of the loop, here are some things that have been occurring at First Church!

### Seder Celebration Thursday, March 24, 2016 6:00pm in the Fellowship Hall (Steven's Room)

Seder Meal

**The Jewish Seder** will be celebrated as closely as possible followed by the Christian Celebration of

Communion. The Seder will include the remembrance of the Passover using the words and foods in a traditional Jewish celebration and a complete celebratory meal of chicken pot roast. This will be the only service on Maundy Thursday. To adequately prepare for the Seder meal **reservations** will be needed. Please sign up on the Board in the back of the sanctuary or call the church office by **Sunday, March 20**. Please also consider helping in the preparation or by supplying food. Sign-up sheets will be on the board.

"The Seder is one part of the present-day Jewish seven-day Passover celebration. The name Passover harks back to the time when God, through Moses, led the Israelites out of their slavery. The Egyptian pharaoh was finally convinced to let the people go when the angel of death killed every firstborn in Egypt but "passed over" the Israelite homes that had put lamb's blood on their doorposts.

**To recall that great deliverance**, the elements of the traditional Seder meal symbolize historically significant features of the Israelite experience. Both the event of God's deliverance and the directions God gave Moses for later commemoration of the Passover history are represented in the Seder ritual and meal.

Christians are particularly interested in this ritual meal because it was during a Passover celebration that Jesus instituted Holy Communion. It should be realized that the Passover clearly predates and is entirely separate from the Eucharist. ... It is a Jewish celebration of freedom useful in helping Christians understand Judaism."


## Narrative Budget First United Methodist Church, Lewistown 200 E. 3<sup>rd</sup> Street, Lewistown, PA 17044

This narrative budget is provided for you to highlight just some of the many exciting life changing ministries that are possible because of your generosity.

Our Finance committee, headed by Laura Buffington, has sought to discover a path to fund important ministries while maintaining our buildings and grounds. The team has offered a modest budget to insure First church has top notch staff and programs designed to make disciples for Jesus Christ and transform Lewistown.

The figure set forth for 2016 is \$348,920.00 and that reflects a 2.2 % decrease in spending. Our Shares of Ministry to the Susquehanna Conference are set at \$43,861.

Here are a few snapshots of just some of the ministry and mission that occurs because of your generosity. Thank you from the bottom of my heart as you continue to lead the way for faith development here in the Juniata Valley and Mifflin county.



First church has excellent staff and the work they do for Christ in His church profoundly impacts our spiritual growth and ability to transform Lewistown and the world beyond. The budget sets aside \$200,069 to support our fine staff.

Finance, Stewardship, and Administrative costs comprise \$4,890 of the budget.

For obvious reasons, caring for our church building and providing funds for utilities and upkeep are vital. Our ministries need to have safe and comfortable places for people to gather in celebration of Jesus Christ. The budget identified \$72,200 for utilities and church maintenance, which includes our van and office equipment.



As your pastoral family, we appreciate the warm beautiful house you provide for our home. We strive to maintain it and care for it as though it were our own. Thank you for loving us by providing such a wonderful living space. The budget has earmarked **\$15,400** to support the parsonage utilities and upkeep.



The continuation of spiritual development within women and men of First church allows growth and movement of the Holy Spirit which leads into the streets to celebrate the Light of Jesus Christ, even in the midst of a secular observance like Halloween. Thank you for sharing your resources so we can push back the darkness to reveal to our community our hope in Jesus Christ!

Thank you for your continued support of ministry and mission at Lewistown First United Methodist Church. Your generosity is making a difference in many lives and families are strengthened.
